3. **Speaking out on issues of importance to the administrative justice community**
 - o acting as a spokesperson on broad issues affecting appointments, tenure, independence, and education of tribunal appointees and staff
 - o carrying out and supporting research and policy development on issues having an impact on administrative justice, tribunals, tribunal appointees, its members, and the public
 - o proposing initiatives and making representations on matters of legislative and policy reforms having an impact on administrative justice, tribunals, tribunal appointees and staff, and the public

 - o working to increase the knowledge of its members and to identify non-financial resources available to them
 - o promoting, encouraging, and working in partnership with other organizations and chapters to ensure educational opportunities exist for tribunals, tribunal appointees and staff, and its members
