Claire is the first Indigenous woman and first Yukon resident to be appointed to the CRTC.

She is a lawyer and a citizen of the Taku River Tlingit First Nation (TRTFN) and has been serving as the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC)'s Regional Commissioner for British Columbia and Yukon since August 2019.

Claire has over a decade of experience working with Indigenous communities on a wide range of matters that ultimately advance reconciliation at both a community-based and governmental level, within her previous private practice at Lackowicz & Hoffman and through her work with Indigenous governments and Ontario's Ministry of Indigenous Affairs.

Claire was vice-chair of the Council of Canadian Administrative Tribunals, a national non-profit organization dedicated to promoting excellence in administrative justice, and past chair of the council's Truth and Reconciliation Committee.

In her free time, Claire enjoys canoeing, skiing, and running on the beautiful territory of the Kwanlin Dün First Nation and the Ta'an Kwäch'än Council, in her home community of Whitehorse, Yukon, and she is grateful for the privilege of living on those territories.
